Selected winners will be published in next year's calendar which will be distributed internationally to raise awareness about Mangrove Forest ecology. We want to promote appreciation and awareness about mangrove forests through this creative contest by encouraging and listening to the imaginative voices of children living in mangrove areas.

### What kind of art can be submitted?

Technique: We would like lots of <u>COLOURFUL</u> work please; no black and white! Paint, color pencil, ink, collage, pastel, crayons, etc. are all accepted. This can be on <u>canvas or paper</u>.



- Dimensions: 45 cm x 30 cm or 18 in x 12 in
- Format: LANDSCAPE: this means the art work should have the longer length across and the shorter length up to down so it will fit on the calendar page. (We have received wonderful art work in portrait in the past but sadly were unable to use it: please make sure we can consider yours!!)
- Artist Identification: On the back of each art work please write in English: the full name and age of the artist, the school name, address, city or town, country and title of art work.
- Age Limit: from 6-16 years old
- Topic: "Why mangroves are important to my community and me"

How will entries be judged? Each school will hold its own exhibition and select 3 winners. These winning entries will
be collected in each country by a participating NGO and mailed to MAP's office to be judged by a team of artists.

**1st Prize:** a certificate + 2 calendars and the recognition of being published in an international calendar with global distribution.

2nd Prize: a certificate + 1 calendar

3rd Prize: a certificate + 1 calendar

**School of winner** in each country will receive 2 calendars

## Some suggested Field Trip and Classroom Lessons

We would suggest coinciding this contest with a Mangrove Ecology Educational Project for the children. This lesson would aim to highlight the importance of mangrove forests for the environment, their community and marine and terrestrial fauna that are linked with mangrove forests. This project could include:

- 1. Information and guidance in the classroom aided by text books, mangrove curriculum, slides and videos.
- Eco-Study Field trips for first-hand observation with the teacher and/or a local resource person. This would allow the
  children to see the many forms of life that inhabit the mangroves, such as the many colored birds, fish, crabs, mollusks,
  reptiles, mammals, and insects while also learning about the unique characteristics of the associated mangrove plants
  and trees.
- 3. During (or after) the field trips, the children can have discussions with their parents or local fisher folk about the mangroves in their region, learning more about the history of the area's mangrove forest, as well as why they are important and what the problems are when the mangroves are lost.

This educational project will hopefully give the children inspiration for their art work as well as an understanding and respect for their mangroves.
