How to Enter in Five Easy Steps

Registration for the 2019 Scholastic Art & Writing Awards opens on Wednesday, September 12, 2018. Deadlines vary by region.

- 1. Create an account on **artandwriting.org/registration**.
- 2. Upload work.
- **3**. Sign submission form.
- 4. Pay your submission fee, or obtain a fee waiver.
- 5. Mail in your submission form.
