Mosaic is a new national initiative to amplify the power of the environmental field by strengthening movement infrastructure.

It is the result of a collaborative design process in which 100+ NGOs, grassroots organizations, and foundations identified how to develop a more powerful and inclusive environmental field by strengthening the shared tools and relationships that empower people and organizations to work together. Using a participatory grantmaking model, Mosaic invests in movement infrastructure like communications, advocacy tools and training, leadership development, field knowledge, backbone services, and networks to better support people working to deliver clean air and water, a safe climate, and healthy and just communities for all. In addition, Mosaic's core values, including being inclusive and co-creative, inspired a bold operating model designed to enable broad collaboration between the organizations, advocates, and activists who are protecting their communities every day. A diverse Governance Assembly that includes a super-majority of NGO and grassroots representatives, working together with funder participants, will lead Mosaic and make grant decisions based on responses to an open and transparent RFP. Overview

Open call: Mosaic governance:

Mosaic is establishing a Governance Assembly of 16 people responsible for implementing strategy and guiding grantmaking for the initiative as it launches. Participating in the inaugural Governance Assembly is an exciting opportunity to make decisions on grants to support diverse participants in the U.S. environmental field—the people and organizations who devote some portion of their efforts in pursuit of environmental protection and healthy & just communities.

A diverse and inclusive group:

We are looking for leaders in the environmental field who are excited about the opportunity to invest through a participatory grantmaking model in 6 areas of movement infrastructure, identified through deep collaborative design with the field (see here). We are seeking to establish a diverse, inclusive and equitable Governance Assembly that is helmed by a supermajority of grassroots and NGO leaders, working with foundation leaders.

Membership info: Governance Assembly members should be able to commit approximately 50-60 hours per year to Mosaic activities both in-person and through virtual meetings. Members of the inaugural Governance Assembly will serve for at least one-and-a-half years and no more than three years. Mosaic will provide meaningful compensation for participants' time.
